

the fine imposed on him at the last Court be remitted, and that he
 find security for the maintenance of the said child, whereupon the
 said John Cavanaugh with Benjamin Cavanaugh his security entered
 into and acknowledged themselves bound to John Page Esquire Governor
 of Virginia the said John Cavanaugh in the sum of one hundred dollars
 and Ben^y Cavanaugh in the sum of fifty dollars of their respective
 lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied and for the use of the
 commonwealth to be rendered yet upon this condition that if the said
 John Cavanaugh shall pay to the overseers of the poor the sum of five
 pounds annually for six years for the maintenance of the said
 child then this obligation to be void and he is full force & virtue
 John Underwood having obtained an attachment against the estate of the
 Pope for two Hundred pounds who hath potentially removed himself or so
 absconded that the ordinary process of the Law cannot be served on him, This
 day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the sheriff having returned
 that he had levied the attachment on one large pine table two Iron
 fire four pewter plates one pewter dish three pewter basins five large
 soap plates one large earthen dish one tin Coffee pot three small mugs
 one milk pot five quart bottles five wooden pails one washing tub
 four wooden benches one black walnut table four chairs one bed &
 furniture four tin Cups two saucers two metal Stoppers earthen Iron
 and haators one butter pot six shallow earthen plates half sized
 table spoons half dozen tea dices one tea pot one sugar dish one metal
 cover one frying pan one loom & gear one pine chest one wooden
 wheel one pot Cards one thread wheel one saddle one axe and two
 Case knives and forks the property of the defendants and he not
 appearing at return the attached effects. Therefore it is considered by
 the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the
 aforesaid sum of two Hundred pounds and his Cost by him in this
 behalf expended and it is ordered that the sheriff sell at public
 auction the attached property for ready money and thereafter re-
 charge the aforesaid sum of two Hundred pounds or so much thereof as the sales
 amount to and return an account of his proceedings to the Court
