

the fine imposed on him at the last court be remitted and that he finds security for the maintenance of the said child, whereupon the said John Odanniley with Benjamin Odanniley his security entered into and acknowledged themselves bound to John Page Esquire Gentleman of Virginia the said John Odanniley in the sum of one hundred dollars and to pay to Odanniley for in the sum of fifty dollars of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied and for the use of the commonwealth to be rendered, yet upon this condition that if the said John Odanniley shall pay to the overseer of the poor the sum of five pounds annually for six years for the maintenance of the said child then this obligation to be void & to be in full force & otherwise.

The Plaintiff having obtained an attachment against the estate of the said Page for two hundred pounds who hath payable remitted himself or else sends that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served on him. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the Sheriff having returned that he had levied the attachment on one large pine table two iron pots four pewter plates one pewter dish three pewter basins five large soap plates one large earthen dish one tea Coffer pot three small mugs one milk pot five quart bottles four water pails one washing tub four wooden bins & one black walnut table four chairs one bed furniture four tea Cups & two saucers the usual softens candle box and box one butter pot six shallow earthen plates half dozen table spoons half dozen tea caddies one tea pott one sugar bowl one water ewer one frying pan one iron griddle one pine chest one wooden wheel one p. Cards one thread wheel and saddle one axe and two Can hammers and forks the property of the defendants and he not now appearing to replyg the attached effects Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the aforesaid sum of two hundred pounds also his Cost by him in this suit expended and it is ordered that the Sheriff sell at public auction the attached property for ready money and thereand overcharge the aforesaid sum of Cost or so much thereof as doth soe amounts to and recieve an account of his proceedings to the Court
