

A Negro man Soloman the property of Presley Bassett was brought into Court by the Sheriff of this county and charged with having stolen the sum of Joshua Fortell of this county by means of a false key on the night of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May between the hours of 12 o'clock & day break with an intention of feloniously taking and carrying away from thence Corn belonging to the said Joshua Fortell in the said Bassett and divers witnesses were examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises and the prisoner heard by Council in his own defense. On consideration whereof out all the circumstances of the case the Court are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty of the said offence therefore it is ordered that he be discharged.
