John Crichlow execution of William Crichlow Esq.

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing that the defendant had had legal notice of this matter and not appearing therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff have execution against the defendant for the sum of forty four pounds two shillings and four pence and his cost by him in this behalf expended to be paid of the goods and chattels of the said William Crichlow at the term of his death in the hands of John Crichlow to be administered to him or his heirs if not the parts to be made of the proper goods and chattels of the said defendant and be in mortgage. But this judgment is to be discharged by the payment of seventy two pounds one shilling & two pence with interest thereon after the rate of 6 per centum per annum from the 15th day of June 1864 till payment.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow 9 o'clock
