

And the court in the said deed at that time for dividing the lands
 whereof Percy Throp was owner did say of Jeremiah Throp as he did
 in possession of amongst the complainers and defendants there divided
 and allotted the said lands in the manner following Viz. to John
 Chubb seventy two acres and bounded as follows, beginning at a red oak
 a corner of the road, then a North forty degrees east one hundred &
 eighty eight pole to a white oak in Robbins branch, then up
 the branch to the road, then along the road to the beginning. To
 Timothy Throp twenty four acres and bounded as follows, beginning at
 the red oak, Chubb corner then a North forty degrees East one hundred &
 eighty eight pole to a white oak in Robbins branch, then up the
 said branch to a sweet gum then a South twenty one degrees West
 to the beginning. To James Throp (with him to James Han) thirty
 four acres and bounded as follows, beginning at a sweet gum in
 Robbins branch, then a South twenty one degrees West one hundred
 and seventy pole to a red oak at the road then up the said road to a
 small red oak then a one hundred and eighty pole to a pine in
 the fork of the pond then to the sweet gum the beginning. To John
 Spenser (with him to John Egan) thirty four acres and bounded as follows
 beginning at a small red oak at the road then a one hundred & eighty
 pole to a pine in the fork of the pond then a one hundred & eighty two
 poles to a pine a corner then to the beginning. To Joseph Throp sixty
 two acres beginning at a pine in Throp's old line then along the said
 line to a stump then a South twenty degrees West ninety five pole
 to the beginning. To Mary Throp sixty two acres and bounded as
 follows, beginning at the stump then a North nine degrees East
 one hundred & seventy five pole to a hickory in the long woods, then
 along a new line to the mouth of Robbins branch then up Robbins
 branch to a pine in the fork of the pond then a South twenty degrees
 West ninety five pole to the beginning. To David Long and Lucy
 his wife, thirty one acres and bounded as follows, beginning at
 a stump a corner of Mary Throp's lot, then along the line
