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their report in the following words to wit: "Conformable to a
decree of the honorable Court of Southampton bearing date September
1804 We have sold the three Negroes (which I have Brown) sold
Sized and prepared and have made equal division of the money
agreeable to the within decree \$ to Henry Browne as his own right
\$ to Henry Browne to be kept by him for Thomas Browne who is
now out of the State and the remaining third to Ebenezer Hastings
We have also taken Henry Brownes bond and William Brydges \$
for Thomas Brownes part which sum is Sixty two dollars and
ninety four Cents Arthur Holliman I have Stephenson Thomas
Stephenson. Whereupon it is decreed and ordered that the ~~deputy~~
aforesaid he make the decree of this Court and that the same
be firm stable and binding between the parties With Costs &
Upon the petition of Benjamin Bradshaw for leave to build a water
grist mill on Franks branch stating that he had lands one side and
that William Dayall owned the lands on the opposite side and pay-
ing for one acre of the said land to abut his dam therefore it is
ordered that the Sheriff summon twelve free and lawful men
to
