report in the following words (and) By Verdict of a certain jury of
the Honorable House of Southampton, made June 18th 1802 that
the said Aaron Thorge and Sarah his wife are
Complainant and Aaron Thorge administrator of Aaron Thorge Dec'd.
Agreeable to said Decree, we sold the said Negro man & wife to Ruff
Blount dec'd for the sum of two hundred and seventy dollars and thirty
four cents which money will be due on the 11th of February next
to your Complainant by the Court, so far to annul their claim
in this case, as to say who they are to pay the money to when
received, we further state, that the said Negro wife was lost by Mary
Thorge to his master during life and was never his & that in the
year 1802, when which time he has been hired for the sum of
twenty five dollars and thirty four cents under the Slave Act of
