 was opposed by Hardy Esq. Attorney for the said black man who
 offered in evidence sundry Papers N. D. S. G. S. & C. and prayed
 that the said Jack Hensley might be discharged in consideration whereof
 the Court being satisfied upon the testimony of said papers that the said Jack
 Hensley came within the meaning and provision of the before recited act
 they do order that the said John Hensley be sold as far as relates
 to the interest of Sarah English who claims agreeable to the said
 act of Assembly, and it is further ordered that the Sheriff, Assessor and Sell
 the said negro Jack according to Law
