This Court on this day declares by answer heard on the bill
and answer, On Consideration whereof it is decreed and ordered that the
Commissaries appointed by a former decree of this Court to lay off and
divide the land and Slaves which were of the down estate of Painesville then
deceased did sell the same (it appearing to the Court by consent of parties
that the same should not be divided among their intestates) in a tract of
nine months taking bond and Security of the purchasers and divide the
proceeds in the following manner (and) That Thomas Westbrooke
then rights of the amount of Sale of the said land, being entitled to 1/3
in his own right, and the other two thirds by the bills of Henry and
William Westbrooke and That they apportion Thomas Westbrooke one eighth
of the proceeds from the sale of the negroes and 2/3 of the proceeds of the negroes
to Peter J. Morgan Sheriff as administrator of William D. Westbrooke
being heirs to the payment of the Debt of the said William D. Westbrooke
One eighth of the sale of the land and Slaves to Henry Dille and daughter
his wife, one eighth to Ambrose Anderson and Sally his wife, one eighth to
Rebecca Teller, one eighth to Pansie Westbrooke and William Westbrooke
to be equally divided between them and the remaining Eighth part Polly
Vaughan to be equally divided among them and make report hereof
to the Court on or before the first day of March next William Allen
