Deft. vs. Plaint.

The Jurors appointed by a decree of this Court to divide
the Estate of Howell Vaughan Decedent this day made their report in
the following words to wit In obedience to an order of Southampton Court
dated February 1800, we the undersigned, whose names have signed
the Estate of Howell Vaughan do hereby agreeable to the said order in
the following manner (to wit) the lands of which he died seized and
possessed we have divided into three parts as may be seen by reference to
the annexed plat which we beg leave to make a part of this report the
same are divided as follows to Levi Knight and wife their third part
(to wit) one hundred and twenty pounds and one hundred and twenty pounds
to Thomas Branch and wife their third part, to wit Eighty and Seventy
five pounds and Nancy Child one hundred and twenty and Eight pounds
and to Fanny Vaughan her third part (to wit) Sixty and nine pounds
and one hundred and twenty pounds and one hundred and twenty pounds and
the remainder of the estate amount to Sixty three pounds three shillings and
three pence to the said Levi Knight and wife their third part
