On the motion of Sally Johnson who made oath according to Law for administration on the Estate of Matthew Johnson deceased, the same is granted her on her giving bond and Security. Whereupon the said Sally Johnson with John T. Blow, Williams Barnes and John Moses her Securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two Thousand Dollars for the said Sally Johnson's due and faithful administration of the Estate of the said Decedent.

Ordered that David Washington, Harry Doyall, Ethelbert C. Williams, William Woods and Richard E. Williams or any three of them being first sworn, do appraise in current-money, the Slaves if any, & personal estate of Matthew Johnson deceased and return the appraisement to the Court.

Richard Blunt is by the Court appointed guardian to Theophilus and Riddick Joiner orphans of Giles Joiner deceased on his giving bond and Security. Whereupon the said Richard Blunt with William Blow his Security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of four thousand Dollars for securing the said orphans estates and the indemnification of the Court.

A Deed of Emancipation from Mary Kinsley to Milly Tucker was proved by the solemn affirmations of Sampson Stanton and William Wrenn witnesses thereto & is ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of David Thomas who made oath according to Law, for administration on the Estate of Binges Bap deceased (the widow relinquishing her right thereof under her hand & Seal) the same is granted him on his giving bond and Security. Whereupon the said David Thomas with James Lundy his Security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred Dollars for the said David Thomas's due and faithful administration of the Estate of the said Decedent.

Ordered that William Lundy, Thomas Milford, Edwin Bap and Harry Sharp Gentlemen or any three of them being first sworn do appraise in current-money, the Slaves if any, and personal Estate of Binges Bap deceased, and return the appraisement to the Court.
