for the forth-
coming of property rendered upon the Service of a writ of
Fieri facias (and out of this Court by the plt against the
said Bailey Lunsford and Bailey Bryant.

This day came the plt by his Attorney, and it appearing by the affidavit
of Archer Whitehead that the defts have had legal notice of this motion
they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore It is considered by the
Court that the plt may have execution against the said defts for
one hundred and nine pounds three Shillings and two pence the
penalty of the said Bond (and his costs by him in this behalf
expended) and the said defts in mercy &c. But this Judgment
is to be discharged by the payment of Fifty four pounds Eleven
Shillings and Seven pence with interest thereon to be computed
after the rate of Six per centum per annum from the
17th day of June 1805. till payment (and the costs.

Ordered that Charles Birdsong, George Gurley Detatham Williams,
Gentlemen or any two of them do examine State and settle
an account of the administration of the Estate of Williams
Bryant deceased, and make report thereof to the Court.

On the motion of Robert Goodwyn Sheriff of this County Bolling
Barnes is by the Court appointed his Deputy, and thereupon
the said Barnes took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth
the oath to support the constitution of the United States (and the
oath of office.

An Indenture of Bargain and Sale between Spratley Williams
of the one part and John Williams of the other part, was
acknowledged by the said Spratley Williams and ordered to be
recorded.

On the motion of Jesse Branch who made oath according to law for adminis-
tration on the Estate of Louisa Summerell deceased, the same is
granted him on his giving bond and Security. Whereupon the said Jesse
Branch with William Washington and Joseph Branch his Sureties entered
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred
Dollars for the said Jesse Branch's true and faithful administration
of the Estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Thaddeus Boykin, William Holden, John Warren and
Drew Branch or any three of them being first sworn do
appraise in current money the slaves, if any, and personal Estate
of Louisa Summerell deceased, and return the appraisement
to the Court.
