 of the town of Jerusalem and thereat stealing taking carry-
 ing away a bay mare the property of which said mare
 was taken under an execution from Sipe Pracey by J^{ts}
 Nicholson & Sheriff of Sam Calvert Sheriff of this county
 and placed by the J^{ts} Sam Calvert in the hands of the afo^r
