

At a court held for Southampton on the 21st day of October 1811

The Testament and last will of Henry Teller was this day presented in court by Christians Teller the executor therein named proved by the oath of Stephen Madell Kinsey B. Putnam & Williams Walshaw the witnesses thereto ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in due form on her giving bond and security. Whereupon the said Christians Teller with James Harris and James Wright her co-executors entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars for the said Christians due and faithful performance of the said will and administration of the estate.

Ordered that David Murdock Joseph Williams Harflett Harris and Daniel Hump or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Henry Teller dec^d and return the appraisement to court.

Indenture of bargain and Sale between Elizabeth Turner of the one part and Ephraim Buz of the other parts was acknowledged by the said Elizabeth party hereto and ordered to be recorded.

The Testament and last will of Theophilus Scott dec^d was this day presented in court by Mary Scott the executrix therein named proved by the oath of Nathaniel Foster, Edmund Cotton and James B. Scott the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executrix who made oath according to law certificate is granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in due form on her giving bond and security. Whereupon the said Mary Scott with Nathaniel Foster and John Bards her co-executors entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two thousand dollars for the performance of his will and administration of the estate.
