

On the motion of James Griffin who made oath according to law for administration on the estate of Hardy Lawrence see the same is granted him on his giving bond and security. Whereupon the said James Griffin with Joshua Corbett and Shadrach Griffin, his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars for the said James Griffin due and faithful administration of the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that James Jones, Presley Barnett, Betway Johnson and Benjamin Withson, or any three of being first sworn before a Justice of the peace for this do appraise in current money the slaves of any and personal estate of Hardy Lawrence decd. and return the appraisement to court.

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing by the affidavit of Beulah Myrick, deputy of James Bee Sheriff that the defendants have had legal notice of the motion they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiffs may have execution against the defendants for twenty four pounds thirteen shillings the penalty of the said bond and their costs by them in that behalf expended and the said defendants in money.

But this Judgment is to be discharged by the payment of seventeen pounds eight shillings with Interest thereon to be computed after the rate of 4s per centum per annum from the 5th day of November 1880 till the time of payment and the cost.
