the condition of the bond the attorney for the plaintiff objected to his testimony
for this that as the Sheriff having made his return on the affidavit in
pursuance of which the bond was taken) that the forthcoming ^{and} no further
no parol testimony could be offered to disprove the Sheriff's return that
being a matter of record and that the defendant's remedy was against the
Sheriff for a false return the opinion of the court being taken they refused
to hear the testimony of Caple to which opinion the attorney for the said
plaintiff and filed his bill of exceptions which was signed and sealed by
the court - Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff may have
Judgment and execution against the defendant for Twenty pounds thirteen shillings
