

That whereas that Thomas Puggin of Thomas Weston personally appeared
 in court and acknowledged themselves and each of them to be indebted to
 George W. Smith Governor of the Commonwealth and his Successors in
 office for the time being in the sum of three hundred and thirty four
 dollars and thirty four cents for themselves and the said Thomas West
 in the further sum of three hundred and thirty four cents for the
 said John Weston to his heirs of their and proper good and lawful uses
 and payments to the use of the Commonwealth in and upon the
 conditions that if the said Thomas Puggin Thomas Weston & John Weston
 do personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court to be taken
 for this county on the 7th day of April next then and there to give
 such testimony as they and each of them shall see and behalf of the
 Commonwealth against Joseph Stone who stands charged with murder
 and shall not depart without leave of the court

 entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of three
 hundred dollars for the said Wm Stone and faithful administration of
 the estate and indemnification of the court
