The plaintiff having obtained an attachment against the respondent and the sheriff having returned the same secured on one negro man named Sam and the defendant not appearing to resist the same and the plaintiff having proved his demand to be just Therefore it is ordered by this court that the plaintiff may have judgment the respondent for his hundred and thirty three pounds five shillings and three pence with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of six per centum per annum from the 11th day of January 1812 till payment and his costs by him in this behalf expended Therefore it is ordered that the sheriff make sale of this said negro for cash first advertising the time and place of such sale according to law and with the proceeds thereof pay and satisfy the plaintiff his demand and his costs aforesaid and the balance if any pay over to the respondent.
