The plaintiff having obtained an attachment against the respondents and the Sheriff having returned the same secured on one negro man named as being and the defendants not appearing to resist the same and the plaintiff having proved his demands to be just Therefore the court doth order that the plaintiff may have judgment the respondents for one hundred and thirty three pounds five shillings and three pence with interest thereof to be computed after the rate of six per centum per annum from the 11th day of January 1772 till payment and his costs by him in this behalf expended Therefore it is ordered that the Sheriff receive sale of the said negro for sale first advertising the times and places of such sale according to law and with the proceeds thereof pay and satisfy the plaintiff his demand and his costs aforesaid and the surplus if any pay over to the respondents

An Indenture of bargain and sale between James and
James his wife of the one part and Holt of the other
part was acknowledged by said James and ordered to be recorded
as to bond

The Testament and last will of John Sawyer decd was this day presented into court by Sam Bowens and Mills Kitchels the executors thereof and proved by the oaths of Joshua Seiver and John Doyal two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded And on the motion of said executors who made oath according to law restitutions were granted them obtaining a probat thereof and saw form on their giving bond of benefit whereupon the said Sam Bowens and Mills Kitchels with Joseph and William Mills their securities entered into and acknowledges themselves the sum of three thousand seven hundred and thirty three pounds and the punctual performance of said will and same on said estate
