Ordered that Drury Williams, William Wells, Samuel Turner, John Corbett and Jesse Langston or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the peace for this county so approved in court money the slaves if any and personal estate of Jeremiah Kane and return the appraisement to court.

James Miller produced to this court a commission from the Governor of this State and in the Seal of the Commonwealth bearing the 17th day of February 1812 appointing him Sheriff of this county to take effect from the expiration of the office of the former Sheriff of this county and moved the court to be admitted to give bond & qualify under the said commission as Sheriff which motion was opposed by Jacob Darden Esq. counsel and it appearing to the court from the record of July court last past that James Miller, James Blount and Jacob Darden, Gustavus Justice were recommended & sworn to be Sheriff of this county for the ensuing year and that the recommendation was forwarded to the Governor and it also appeared from the testimony of Samuel Rice clerk of this court that James
