James Rochelle is by this court appointed clerk thereof to supply the vacancy occasioned by the death of Samuel Helle Esq. late clerk of this court, whereupon the said James Rochelle together with John Rochelle, Clements Rochelle, John Thomas, William Blow and George Surley his Securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars for the due and faithful performance of the duties thereof, and thereupon the said James Rochelle took the oath to suppress sedition, the oath to support the constitution of the United States, the oath of fidelity to this commonwealth and the oath of office -
