

by counsel, the court after hearing the testimony, and all the circumstances, of the case being ended in favour. It is noted that the defendant be discharged from further prosecution on this behalf.

On the motion of Benjamin Allen, for reimbursement of money paid by him for taxes and damages on certain land. It is considered by the court that he takes judgment for his action and stops by costs the tax and damages on a tract of land situated in the name of Richard Williams for the nonpayment of the taxes thereon for the years 1795, 1796 & 1797 the attorney for the complainant being present.

For reasons appearing to the court It is noted that the order of the last court (relative to the overseer of the poor to bond out William Doyle he returned and the same is hereby accordingly recorded -

On the motion of Jacob Darden (the attorney for the complainant being present) who proved by sufficient evidence to the court that the land returned in the name of Elizabeth Darden for the years 1798 & 1799 since purchased and now belongs to said Jacob Darden and that the taxes thereon charged are not to rise and an order was therefore made by the court that he have judgment for the payment from the payment of taxes and damages thereon for the years aforesaid -

It appearing to the Justices of the Court that Mary Wardham whose husband was in the service of the United States is still living and on that account therefore it is ordered that she be allowed five pounds for her pin money for the present year.

An Indenture of bargain and Sale between John With of the One part and Edmund Dealy of the other part was acknowledged John With party thereto and agreed to be registered to the county Court of Southampton for record -

The commissioners appointed by a former Res of this court to make sale of the land whereof William Drury said he was the owner made their report in the words following to wit: In pursuance to a decree of the worshipful court of Southampton made February court 1813 to make sale and convey of the tract of land belonging to the late William Drury and as the acting commissioners Henry Phelps, Richard Harris and Edmund Turner have made sale of said land which amount was £ 209 5 To Nathaniel Jones one whole share to w^t 2 3 To Philip Biggins one half share to w^t 1 p To Edmund Drury, Charles Drury, Sally Drury, Daniel Drury, Rebecca Drury and William Drury to one eighth and one sixth of one eighth to w^t 2 3 3 p. There are three bonds we have obtained in our hands, To wit: Sally Drury & William Drury of age but not capable of acting for themselves in this are bonds and was also Charles Drury's bond as he is absent from the State and has been for a Term of years and cannot be held of. Given under our hands this 15th Oct^r 1814 Henry Phelps, Richard Harris, Edmund Turner which is ordered to be made firm stable and binding between the parties and that the costs be born proportionally by them.
