

The person appointed by a former order of this court to under the land along Southwick
and Sibley this day underlaid report on the work following to wit: Agreeable to an order
of the county court of Southampton to an executed hearing etc
we the undersigned have gone on the land of Jacob Dick and others with the surveyor
and by the order we were required and have now set out and divided all the land of said and
having regard to quantity as well as quality by proper rods and bounds as follows to wit
Beginning at a red standing on the South side of Duck penning a certain distance
William land running thence S 77° West 100 pole to a fence in Woods and then in
corner of Mr. William land there north 55° West 200 pole to a fence after and off there
along on the bank of the Islands of Notthing river thence being a bearing line of
Nick of William, thence N 55° W 244 pole to where Mr. Williams line and John Univers
intersects each other in the Islands of the said river thence S 42° west 142 pole to a
maple standing on the bank of Notthing river, thence down the said river the various
course thereof to a gun standing on the side of said river not far from the upper
bridge a new corner made in the lower line of Elizabeth Vick, the widow of richard Vick
the said Josiah Vick etc and from thence along the said river line the various
course thereof running on the outer back of the garden of the St. Elizabeth and so
on to the road leading from the upper bridge to Somersett and from thence along
Samuel Battons lines to the first station. The above mentioned long Richard Vick
proportionable part of the 879 acre tract which was formerly called the Moseley tract
subject to the power of his mother below Elizabeth Vick, which mention will
hereafter follow. Hence beginning at a gun standing near the upper bridge and
running along the river to a red oak at the foot of the upper bridge thence running
along through the various course thereof until the said red oak falls the river,
thence to a new corner made in the river line and thence along the river line generally
bearing the name line of Elizabeth Vick, proportionable part of the 879 acre tract
including the two swelling houses garden &c to her son in the said land

Then beginning at a red oak standing at the foot of the upper bridge on the bank of
Notthing river, running thence the various course of the river to the river line of
Richard Vick and Josiah Vick thence N 35° East 240 pole along that river line to the
branch called the hoggs branch thence down that said branch to a black pine tree
N 35° W 244 pole to the St. Station being lot No. 1 of the Kirby tract of land and
to Richard Vick by Josiah Vick in his will which tract of land contained 200 acres and
the lot No. 1 containing 100 acres being Richard Vick's proportionable part of the said
land which tract of 100 acres is subject to Elizabeth Vick's power of 50 acres however
as by proper rods and bounds within the above Dugdale's boundaries.

Hence beginning at the above mentioned running line of Richard Vick and Josiah Vick running
down the Notthing river to the out bound over the hogg branch and running thence N 35°
W 240 pole to a red oak standing on the top of black branch thence along that branch
the various course thereof to the aforesaid river running line of Richard Vick and Josiah Vick to
thence N 35° W 244 pole to the first station being lot No. 2 of Kirby tract of land
which by his father in his will containing 100 acres which is Josiah Vick's proportionable
part of the said land subject to power right of his mother in law which is agreed
