This Cause was this day argued by counsel of the parties and the Court and
Counsel, and the Court taking the bill as confessed against the said defendant Maximilian
Whitehead It appearing that the said husband made in this cause against him back then only
published in the Petersburg Intelligencer for two months successively, both before and after the
decree that Clements Rockdale Will Morell, Samuel Staged and James Major, then
Thomas and Prentiss Stanley, or any three of them assessed by the Surveyor of Southampton
County to divide the lands lying in the said County of which John Whitehead has title, not
involving the lands which he now has by virtue of the last will and Testament of the said
John Whitehead deceased into his equal parts and all the one of the said parts to the
complainant Adolphus Whitehead, another of the said parts to the defendant Asher Head
Whitehead another of the said parts to the defendant Lucretia M. Whitehead and another of the said
parts to the defendant Maximilian Whitehead That they subdivide the remaining two parts
parts being those to which Lewis Augustus Whitehead and Jacob Anthony Whitehead are entitled
into seven equal parts of such subdivision will yield a sum exceeding one hundred dollars
to each of the said shares, if not that they sell the remaining two parts at public
auction on a trial of twelve months giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale
and requiring a bond or bonds, with approved security from the purchaser or purchasers
and divide the proceeds of the said sale into seven equal parts, and in which event whether for
Subdivision a sale of the said remaining two parts to all of the said seven parts
to the complainant Adolphus Whitehead, another of the said parts to the complainant Catharine
Bard except of his wife Harriet, another of the said parts to the defendant Lucretia
Whitehead, another of the said parts to the defendant Martha Hill and John Anthony Hill
in right of their marriage, Martha Sally Musters Hill to be delivered or paid over to their
guardian Arthur A. Carr, another of the said parts to the defendant Lucretia M. Whitehead
another of the said parts to the defendant Maximilian Whitehead and the remaining seventh
part to the defendant Lucretia Whitehead But it appearing to the Court that the defendant
Lucretia M. Whitehead by act of Bargain and Sale bearing date the 24th day of April 1797
she her acte ensigned interest in the aforesaid land in the Temple to the defendant Lewis
Morell it is further ordered and directed, that the parts before directed to be allotted to the said
Lucretia M. Whitehead, be afterwards allotted and transferred to the said Lewis Morell and
it appearing also to the Court, that the defendant Maximilian Whitehead together with
Lucretia Whitehead now act by act of Bargain and Sale bearing date the 6th day of January
1798 for forty Seven acres and one fifth part of an acre of the aforesaid land
