

are few samples to the defendants Andrew Whitfield by the following bondsmen here named bondsmen. and that the said defendants Alapinidian Whitehead, by each of bargain and sale, bearing date the 6th day of November 1798, also the three hundred and one sons of the aforesaid land in few samples to the defendant Jack Burrell by the following bondsmen (here insert bondsmen). It is further ordered, and decreed that the said Commissioners assign the parts, before directed to be allotted to the said Alapinidian Whitehead, within the aforesaid bondsmen, so near as may be practicable consistently with Justice to the three parties entitled, and the Court not yet knowing as whether they could be put at all, will hereafter make an order relative to their said several purchases from the said Alapinidian Whitehead. It is further ordered, decreed and decreed by the Court that the aforesaid Commissioners or any three of them, do divide all the slaves of John Whitehead deceased, which remained at the death of his widow Merriam Whitehead into seven equal parts, if such division can be made of and, that they sell the said slaves at Public Auction, at a credit of twelve months giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale, and taking bonds with approved security from the purchasers, and divide the proceeds of the said sale into seven equal parts, and in return with whether of a division in kind or a sale of the said slaves, that they allot one of the said seven parts to the Complainant Adolphus Whitehead, another of the said parts to the Complainant Calhoun Bond in right of his wife Harriet, another of the said parts to the defendants Andrew Mead Whitehead, another of the said parts to the defendants Martha Hill and John Anthony Hill in right of their deceased mother Sally Matilda Hill, to be delivered or paid over to their Guardian Arthur A. Carr and another of the said parts to the defendants Lucinda Whitehead that they subdivide the remaining two seventh parts, being those to which the said deceased Augustus Whitehead and Jack Anthony Whitehead were entitled in five equal parts, and allot one of the said parts to the Complainant Adolphus Whitehead, another of the said parts to the Complainant Calhoun Bond in right of his wife Harriet, another of the said parts to the defendants Andrew Mead Whitehead, another of the said parts to the defendants Martha Hill and John Anthony Hill in right of their deceased mother Sally Matilda Hill to be delivered or paid over to their Guardian Arthur A. Carr and the remaining fifth part to the defendants Lucinda Whitehead, the aforesaid Samuel Whitehead and Alapinidian Whitehead, being excluded from this division, because it appears to the Court that they have heretofore received their full proportions of the said slaves. It is further ordered, that the said Commissioners make a report of their doings and doings in this behalf, to the Court in order to a final Decree.

And Inventory and appraisement of the estate of Mary Edwards deceased made this day, returned and ordered to be recorded.
