 a Whifflet they will forfeit at all will hereafter make an even rate to the said
 several purchasers from the said Maymilian Whithead. It is further agreed and
 agreed by the Court that the aforesaid Commissioners or any three of them, or
 more all the slaves of John Whithead deceased which remained at the death of
 his widow Elizabeth Whithead into seven equal parts if such division can be made
 of not, that they sell the said slaves at Public Auction as a credit of twelve months
 given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale are taking bonds with
 approved security from the purchasers, and divide the proceeds of the said sale
 into seven equal parts, and in whom want whether of a division as kind or a sale
 of the said slaves that they sell one of the said seven parts to the complainant Adolphus
 Whithead, another of the said parts to the complainant Catharpf Bone in right of
 her wife Bennett, another of the said parts to the defendant Archer Mead Whithead
 mother of the said parts to the defendants Martha Hill and John Anthony Hill in
 right of their deceased mother Sally Whithead Hill, to be delivered or paid over to their
 Guardian in them a care and another of the said parts to the defendant Lavinia
 Whithead that they subdivise the remaining two seventh parts, being those to which the
 aforesaid Augustus Whithead are Jacob Anthony Whithead see written in four
 equal parts, are sell one of the said parts to the complainant Adolphus Whithead
 another of the said parts to the complainant Catharpf Bone in right of his wife Bennett
 another of the said parts to the defendant Archer Mead Whithead, another of the said
 parts to the defendants Martha Hill and John Anthony Hill in right of their deceased
 mother Sally Whithead Hill to be delivered or paid over to their Guardian Arthur Colver
 and the remaining fifth part to the defendant Augustus Whithead, the aforesaid Samuel
 M. Whithead and Maymilian Whithead, being excluded from the division because
 it appears to the Court that they have heretofore received their full proportion of the said
 slaves. It is further ordered that the said Commissioners make a report of their
 actions and doings in this behalf, to the Court in order to a final decree.
