 reasonable public notice of the same oppose & publish sale on a court of record within
 the parish or lot of land lying in this County of which the late Mary Edwards
 was seized ^{concerning}. Sales are which said land descended to the said
 Mary Edwards by the death of her late brother Benjamin Edwards, that they take
 one bond from the purchaser or purchasers with good security made payable to the
 Complainant George Edwards for one tenth part of the amount of the sale of the
 said parcel of land in the manner like manner for one seventh part
 made payable to the complainant Ned Edwards, one other bond in like
 manner for one seventh part made payable to the Complainants David Newcom
 in right of his wife Lucy or other bond in like manner for one tenth part
 made payable to the complainant Ann Davis, one other bond in like manner
 for one seventh part made payable to John Thomas Garrison to the Complainants
 Thomas H. Edwards Priscilla D. Edwards and Sarah Edwards one other bond in like
 manner for one seventh part made payable to the defendant Elizabeth Edwards and
 that they divide the remaining seventh part of the amount of sales into three equal
 parts and take one bond with sufficient security for one third of the said last mentioned
 seventh part payable to the defendant George Edwards, one other bond in like
 manner for one third of the said one seventh part payable to the defendant
 Martha Edwards and one other bond in like manner for the remaining one
 third of the said one seventh part payable to John Moore for the benefit of the
 defendants Sally Moore, Catherine Moore, Elizabeth, John & Moore, and Henry
 & Moore and it is further ordered that the aforesaid persons do execute a good due
 sufficient deed of conveyance in fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers of the
 said parcel of land and that they make a report to this Court of their
 selling and doing herein in over to a final Decree.

Samuel Drury appeared in Court according to the condition of his recognizance to answer
 the complaint of ^{against him for a breach of the peace whereinupon the parties}
 being fully heard it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said
 Samuel Drury give security for his good behavior for the term of twelve months
 that is to say hundred in the sum of Two Thousand dollars with two hundred
 to be bound with him in the sum of One Thousand dollars each and in default
 thereof that he be committed to Gaol.

An Indictment of layman and sale between Richard Henry Edwards and William
 Edwards and Fanny & his wife of the one part and Thomas Newcom of the other
 part was this day presented in Court with the certificate of the Clerk of Superior Court
 certifying the same to have been there duly proved and ordered to be certified to the Clerk
 which is cause to be hereunder.
