 accompanied by the surveyor of this County do lay off all one eighth of the complainant
 Tolly Woodard one third part of the lake and plantation whereof the said John Woodard
 did die and possess as one for her share in the same having regard to quality as
 well as quantity that the said commissioners or any three or more of them do allot
 and set apart to the said Complainant Tolly Woodard one third part of the same (whereof
 the said John did die) as one for her share in the same having regard to their
 respective valuations that they or any three or more of them do make sale of the remaining
 two thirds of the land and slaves whereof the said John did die and possess as a
 Credit of months first giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale
 writing bond with approved security in equal proportion to the complainants Marcy
 Anthony Billy Rebecca Samuel Jesse and Spence Woodard heirs of the said John
 Woodard and that they assign the same to them respectively or to their guardians and
 it is further ordered and decreed that the said commissioners or any three or more of them
 make a deed of conveyance or fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers of the said land
 slaves and that they make a report to this Court of their doings and savings in this
 behalf in order to a final Decree.
