This Cause was this day again heard by reason of the parties and agent of the court on the bill the answer of the defendants, and the decree rendered by the County Court of Southampton at the last Term, the same was argued by counsel, and it being represented to the court that it would be impudent at this time to hear any division of the slaves one lane of which the said John Phipps deceased was possessed among the complainants. Therefore by Consent of the parties it is Considered by the Court, that the said decree rendered at the last term by the County Court of Southampton be remitted and remitted and that so much of the bill of the complainants as prayes for such division be dismissed, but without prejudice to any proceedings which may hereafter be instituted for that purpose, and the court retaining so much of the said bill as prayes for the allotment of slaves to the defendant Nancy Phipps widow and relict of the said John Phipps deceased with now argyld, over and above that shee Barbara David Wethrock, Allen Jones and Wiley Francis a any three of them attested by the Surveyor of Southampton County shall and are set apart to the said Nancy Phipps for the term of her natural life having regard as well as quality as quantity, one third part of the tract or parcel of land, situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation Three hundred and forty three acres of which he deceased husband John Phipps deceased was her owner therein. That the said complainants or any three of them as also all be set apart to the said Nancy Phipps for the said term of her natural life one third of the following slaves to wit, say, Peter, before who appear by the bill and answer to be of no value, Obsey Betty, Rufus, Mary and Harriett, of which her deceased husband were possessed as her own slaves but that they made a report of their actions and enrys in this behalf to the court.
