Thence Beginning at a new Corner made in Joseph Whitehead's Lott No. 5 among Whitehead's surveys, running thence N. 60. W. 66 pds to a small pine tree a Corner in Newbury Whitehead's lines, thence S. 75. E. 34 pds, thence S. 60. E. 134 pds to a Corner in Newbury's Survey thence S. 45. N. 70 pds to a new Corner made in a small branch a Corner of Joseph Whitehead's Lott No. 3, and from thence along that line, that David Whitehead and Whitehead's Lott No. 3 to the first Station containing 377 Acres valued at 4 p. makes 155 pds. which Lott of Land was assigned to Nathan Whitehead within the bounds of the same from whence he made the purchase which was done in conformity to a Deed as above said by a Deed of bargain and Sale from Joseph Whitehead and William Whitehead's trustee & Mother being date the 5th day of January 1792, which was assigned to him as his portion in the lands of the D. of West-Ind. Whitehead's estate deceased Mother agreeable to the report of the Deeds above said -

Thence beginning at a place in Nathan Whitehead's and William Allen's line, running thence N. 80. W. 80 pds to a new new Corner made in Archer's Whitehead's Lott No. 1 being the first Lott in the subdivision, running thence N. 5. W. 65 pds to a new Corner made in Lott No. 2. and 3. thence see East 93 pds to a new Corner in Allen's line being a new Corner of Archer's and Phill's children's Lott No. 1 and 2. and thence see South 76 pds to the first Station being Lott No. 1. in the Subdivision containing 377 Acres which Lott was drawn by Archer's Whitehead's value at 4 dollars p. acre making 150 dollars which is his part of the 2/3 of the lands of John Whitehead deceased and was attested to be subdivided into equal parts which Lott there is to come 84. 66 to which sum added together makes 84. 66 each one's proportionate part of the subdivision, and by his drawing over his portion in this equal division, he pays from his Lott the sum of 13 dollars to Phill's children's Lott No. 2 which after paying that sum exact it from that whole amount which he owes, which was 94. 66, you will find that it leaves 93. 46 but his full portion of the Division and Subdivision -

Thence Beginning at a new Corner in Allen's and Line, running thence see North 60 pds to another new Corner in Allen's and line being a Corner of Phill's children's and Lewis Monelle's Lott No. 2 and 3. thence see West 102 pds to a new Corner made in Lewis Monelle's children's and by the said Bonds Lott No. 2-3 and 5. thence S. 60. E. 64 pds to a new Corner made in Lott 1. 2. and 4. and thence see East 93 pds to the first Station being Lott No. 2. in the Subdivision containing 377 Acres valued at 4 dollars p. acre which Lott was drawn by Phill's children's making 150 dollars which is their proportionate part of 2/3 which was subdivided into 6 equal Shares of the lands of John Whitehead deceased in right of their deceased Mother Whitehead's Will after receiving from Archer's Whitehead's Lott No. 1 in the division and Subdivision the sum of 13 dollars and from Lewis Monelle's Lott No. 2 and 3 in the division and Subdivision the sum of 74 dollars which sum added together makes 93. 46, their proportionate part of the said lands in right of their deceased Mother -

Thence Beginning at a new Corner in William's Allen's and line a Corner of Lott No. 2 and 3 running thence see North 10 pds to a Sweet Gum a Corner of William Allen's and 2 sides of a pond, thence N. 46. W. 138 pds to a small sweet Gum a Corner of Allen's thence S. 84. W. 14 pds to a small Sweet Gum Corner of John Hall's thence S. 45. E. 40 pds to a new oak Oak corner of the said Hall's, thence S. 5. E. 70 pds to a new Corner a corner with Lott No. 4 and 5 and thence see East 103 pds to the 1st Station, being Lott No. 2. which
