 And the Grand Jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

The persons appointed by a former order of this Court to let the repairs of black Creek bridge
 this day make their report in the words and figures following to wit, We conformably
 to the order annexed the the commissioners did proceed on the 11th March, after having
 one notice to let the repairs of black Creek bridge. The lowest unsuitable to wit,
 Shera Whitland for the sum of twenty nine dollars and twenty five cents bond and twenty
 for the putback of the said bridge and to let completed by the 15th May next. Henry Lewis and

 pole to a pine flat a corner of Benjamin Whitfield and then a corner of lot No 2
 thence N. 15. 11 1/4 pole to the Branch called the Honey branch, thence along that branch
 to where it intersects the Little Swamp, and thence along the Little Swamp to the first station
 containing 6 1/2 acres being the corner right of - Edwards meadow and relief of John Edwards
 deceased, which we have assigned to him for life, so by the acres were required, thence beginning
 at a new corner made in William Boone and Edly Edwards lot No 1 and V running thence
 S. 50. 2 1/2 pole, thence due south 25 pole, thence S. 45. 1 1/2 pole to the road thence N. 15. 2 1/2 pole
 to a white oak a corner of Benjamin Whitfield in the Branch, thence N. 80. 11 1/4 pole thence
 N. 25. 11 1/2 pole to a new corner made in lot No 1 and V thence S. 50. 11 1/4 pole along
 the winding line of lot No 1 and V to the 1st Station containing 80 Acres being at 2. 50 cents
 1/2 acre amounting to 180 50 long lot No 1. Which lot was known by William Boone in
 right of his deceased mother Nancy Boone formerly Nancy Edwards being her proportionable
 part of the said lands after receiving from lot No 3 the sum of 130 which sum was due to
 130 makes 180 50 cents William Boone's proportionable part of the said lands in right of
 his deceased mother, after taking one equal division in the townright of Mary Edwards
