 Peterson Edwards and William Edwards and there along the bearing line of lots No 5
 Edwards and William Edwards lot No 7 and 8 to the first station containing 14.44 Acres

 convenience and inconveniences attending the turning the said road and have agreed
 to the best of our judgments that in turning the road the publick at large will be benefitted
 in the distance that we think, the new road is a few yards the nearest, and as to
 the Special benefit of Abner Corlett himself as an individual, we believe that it
 will save him nearly 10,000 miles or at least 1000 Barrels of flour and besides that
 as it respects the situation of this Plantation by turning the road it certainly will be a
 very great addition in the looks of this plantation it makes more convenience with
 respect to the situation of his house and in planting his orchards. and as it respects
 the inconveniences of the new road we believe that the new road will not be at time
 be a tolerable good road and nearly as good as the old one it is not exactly as good
