further decreed and ordered that the claim which the said Millikin has yet  
unadjusted amounting to the sum of Fifty two dollars and Twenty five cents the  
balance of the difference in the exchange of lands aforesaid remain as an equitable  
sum which the tract aforesaid by him to be conveyed to the heirs of William Woodard and

This Cause being docketed came on this day by consent of parties and spirit of the  
Court to be heard on the bill and answer and arguments of counsel therewithal and  
upon due consideration thereof has the court with order adjudge and decree that  
Samuel Cobb, Richard Williams, John Moore and Benjamin Devaney or any two  
or more of them make sale of the tract of land conveyed by James Millikin to the heirs of William  
Woodard deceased on a credit of nine months giving reasonable notice of the  
time and place of sale that from the proceeds of the sale they take a bond payable  
to James Millikin for the sum of Fifty two dollars and Twenty five cents that being  
the sum due to said Millikin for which he has an equitable sum in said land  
and they take another bond with security for the one hundred and twenty five cents  
of sale payable to the complainant Elizabeth Woodard widow of the said in one year that they  
divide the balance into seven equal parts taking separate bonds with sufficient security for each & one  
seventh part payable to the Plaintiff or guardians of the infant defendants, Sally, Charles, Davis  
William, John, Elizabeth and Amy Woodard, and that they make a good and sufficient deed  
of conveyance in fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers of said tract of land and further  
that they make a report of their actions and doings in this behalf to the Court in one year to a  
just & honest decision.
