

and Thomas White, in manner and form following (to wit)
 In the first place we proceeded to settle all the negroes belonging to the
 estate namely Peter 300 dollars, James 300 dollars, Jacob 300 dollars
 Fanny 300 dollars, Venus 300 dollars Maria 300 dollars, Henry 150 dollars
 Hansel 175 dollars and Amy 75 dollars making in the whole valuation
 2375 dollars, then allotting and setting apart for life in the first place
 to Mary White widow and relict of Phelly White deceased as her
 dower for life one third part of the valuation of the slaves which is
 779 1/3 dollars 53 cents and have assigned to her the following negroes
 namely Jacob, Value at 300 dollars Maria 300 dollars and Hansel 175
 dollars making 825 which is 3 1/3, 53 cents more than her proportion of
 dower in the aforesaid slaves, but is as near as we can Phelly
 allot them of which sum of 33.33 cents she said Mary White will pay
 to Thomas & White Lott of slaves in order to make up his proportion of the
 remaining two thirds of negroes aforesaid -
 Also we have allotted said 1/3 and assigned to Jacob Duck in right
 of his wife Nancy Duck formerly Mary White his proportionable
 part of the remaining two thirds of the said slaves which is 527 1/3
 and set apart the following negroes to make that sum which Lott
 he draws namely, Peter valued at 300 dollars and Venus at 300 dollars
 making in all 600 dollars which is 70 1/3, 17 cents more than his proportion
 in the remaining two thirds of the said slaves which sum of 70 1/3, 17 cents
 Jacob Duck pays to Thomas & White Lott of slaves in order to make an
 equal proportion in the division of the remaining two thirds
 which sum of 70 1/3, 17 cents deducted from 600 dollars leaves 527 1/3
 83 cents his full proportionable part of the said slaves in right of his
 wife Nancy. Also we have allotted assigned and set apart to the
 said White infant child of Phelly White deceased his full proportionable
 part of the remaining two thirds of the slaves of the said deceased
 namely sum 300 dollars and sum 180 dollars making 530 dollars
 which is 2 1/3, 17 cents more than his proportion in the remaining two
 thirds of the slaves aforesaid, which you may see by deducting 2 1/3
 from 530 1/3 leaves 527 1/3 his full proportionable part of the said slaves
 after paying to Thomas & White Lott the sum of 2 1/3, 17 cents in order
 to make his full proportion in the remaining two thirds of slaves
 aforesaid - Also we have allotted and assigned to Thomas & White
 infant child of Phelly White deceased the following slaves to wit, sum
 valued at 300, and Amy 75 dollars making 420 dollars which is
 his proportionable part of the remaining two thirds of the slaves
 aforesaid, after receiving from Mary White widow and relict of
 Phelly White regard the sum of 33 1/3, 53 cents and from Jacob Duck
 and Thomas & White Lott of 2 negroes the sum of 2 1/3, 17 cents and from
 Venus added to 420 dollars makes 527 1/3, 83 cents his full proportion of
 the remaining two thirds of the slaves belonging to the estate of his deceased
 father. Hence under and under this 16. day of June 1815. Petros
