 apprais in current money the value of any and personal estate of John
 Simmons deceased and return the appraisement to the Court —

Ordered that John Fort, James Frequent and hollow Kitchin or any two of them
 do let the building of a Pillory, Stocks and Whipping post to the lower end of the
 square such place as they may think most advisable, taking bond and security
 from the undertaker for the faithful completion of the same and that they
 offer the site thereof at their discretion —

Ordered that John Fort, James Frequent and hollow Kitchin or any two of them do
 make sale of the old Jail to the highest bidder on a Credit till May Court next
 and make a report thereof to the Court —

Ordered that John Fort, hollow Kitchin and James Frequent or any two of them
 do rent out the store house now occupied by Theodore Frequent, to the highest
 bidder untill May Court next and make report thereof to the County —
