apprised to the said Sally Barbara after dinner on the day of which she was sold Barbara was required to give her two negroes Sandy and Lucy into full equal joint tenancy with the appraised security for each separate part and apportion one equal fifth part to Wilkinson & Bellott who claims under his deceased wife Lucy one other part is retained by Barbara one other part to James Barbara one other part to James Barbara and the remaining other part to Charles Barbara and that they also divide the proceeds of the aforesaid tract of land into five equal parts taking care with appraised security for each separate part and apportion one equal fifth part to each of the bankrupts Nathaniel & Barbara James Barbara and Anne Barbara one other part to Charles Barbara and the remaining fifth part they are to apportion over to Wilkinson & Bellott the natural guardians of the infant Children Lewis, Sally, Patsey, Nancy, Charles George, Benjamin, William and Nathaniel W. Bellott to be held by them for the benefit of the said infants the said Wilkinson hereinafter referred to them all his interest which he might claim as tenant by the bounty in said tract of land and that they refer to this court of their action as being herein in order to a judgment.

The persons appointed at November Court 1813 to make up the account of Joseph Drury and seized and forfeited this day made their report in the mode set in figures following (to wit)

Apparel to the widow decree no the misnamed have proceeded to be offered to the compleatment Barbara Drury & of the sum of which herable herland Joseph Drury died possessed as also to part of the negroes of her said Barbard for and in view of her debts in the said negroes as by the said decree may be directed amounting to four hundred and fifteen dollars 93 $\frac{1}{2}$  p<sup>s</sup> Costs and expenses also taken to be paid by the guardian of the orphans of the said Joseph Drury widow amounting to two thousand and twenty five dollars and eighty seven cents now under our hands this 20<sup>th</sup> June 1815. Rosay Drury, the designee before-named Whereupon it is desired and ordered that the aforesaid mode as aforesaid be held firm and stet forever and that the costs be proportionably borne betwixt the parties.

Colonel Rochelle is by the court recommended to his Excellency the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to be Captain of a Company of militia with the Regiment in the name of Richmond Dillard who shall recruit and Archer M. Whitfield to be Lieutenant and and Samuel Magrath to be Surgeon to the said Company —
