

agreed to the said Sally Barham as her dower in the slave of which the said said Barham was possessed to public sale on a credit of nine months that they divide the proceeds of the sale of the slave in two equal parts and assign one equal fifth part to William W. Bopell the claim under his dower, the other part to Nathaniel H. Barham, one other part to James Barham one other part to Jane Barham and the remaining other part to Charles Barham and that they also divide the proceeds of the several tract of land into five equal parts taking therefrom several several for each separate part, and assign one equal fifth part to each of the complainants Nathaniel H. Barham, James Barham and Jane Barham one other part to Charles Barham and the remaining fifth part they are to assign over to William W. Bopell the natural guardian of his infant children Lewis, Sally, Patsy, Nancy, Charles Mary, Benjamin, William and Nathaniel W. Bopell is to hold the same for the benefit of the said infants the said William W. Bopell here in court swears to them all his interest which he might claim as tenant by the courtesy in said tract of land and that they report to this court of their acting and doing herein in order to a final decree.

The persons appointed at November court 1813 to make up said dower of the said Joseph Drury and seized and possessed the say made their report in the mode and figures following (to wit)

1. agreeable to the within decree we the undersigned have proceeded to lay off and assign to the complainant Nathaniel Drury & of the same of which heretofore the said Joseph Drury did possessed as also a part of the negroes of her said husband for and in dower of her dower in the said negroes as by the said decree we are directed
 2. amounting to four hundred and fifteen dollars & 75 cts and have also taken
 3. bonds payable to the guardians of the orphans of the said Joseph Drury amounting to two thousand and seventy by dollars and eighty four cts. Brought over
 4. our hands this 20th June 1816. Henry Briggs, John Bingham commissioners.
- Whereupon it is decreed and ordered that the aforesaid make as aforesaid, be held firm and settle forever and that the costs be proportionally borne between the parties.
