of Southampton to us directed bearing date January Court 1815 we have
gone over the lands of William Bell deceased son of Burwell Bell
attended by the County Surveyor as by the order was to be required and have
run out all the bounds of the said deceased and apportioned the quantity
thereof and find there to be in the whole tract 431 Acres, and also have
a land of, and assigned to Elizabeth Bell widow and relict of William.
Bell deceased for life one third part of the said lands by Proper rods
and bounds having regard to quality as well as quantity, the manner
and form following (to wit) Thence Beginning at a pine standing
on the side of the road leading from Cypress Bridge to Long Keye
running thence N. 75. 30° pole to a new corner made in the lower line
thence along the lower line E. 10. 3. 185 pole to new corner in a branch
on the old bounds thence S. 7. W. 56. pole to the road aforesaid, thence
N. 7. W. 65. pole to three trees pine on the side of the same branch
thence N. 54. 10. 30° pole to the lower corner of Robins Arises fence thence
W. 50. N. 28. pole adjoining Etherton & Brightwells line, thence W. 14. N. 56
pole to a pine a corner of Zacharias Stay also from thence E. 6. S. 140
pole to the first Station containing 143^{1/2} Acres which land is laid
off and assigned to Elizabeth Bell, widow and relict of William Bell
deceased as her down right for life in the said lands, given under
our hands this 20th day of February 1815, John Thomas, George
Bailey, Samuel Negus Communejores. Whereupon It is Ordered
and ordered that that the division made as aforesaid be held Fair and
Stable justice and that the costs be proportionably borne between the parties

On the motion of Sept. Southford, It is ordered that he be remunerated from the
payment of the taxes and damages on one hundred and fifty acres of land
which was returned in the name of Sept. Southford for the year 1795 & 1797
also from the payment of the taxes and damages on two hundred and thirty
four acres of land which was returned in the name of Elizabeth Southford
for the year 1805, (The attorney for the Commonwealth being present)
