1805 the Attorney for the Commonwealth being present.

On the motion of William Peters. It is ordered, That ~~service~~ that he be compensated from the payment of the legal and damages on a trial of cause terminating eight days and three quarters ago which was returned, as the name of Harry Murphy for the years 1775-1800 and 1831 (The attorney for the term unexecuted being present)
