Mary Barrett widow and relict of Parley Barrett deceased personally appeared in Court and declared that she will not take or accept the provision made for her by her deceased husband in his last will and Testament or any part thereof and hereunto she beareth the right claim by the said Will, which is ordered to be entered of record.

The judges appointed by a former order of this Court to let the repairs of Securus Mills belong to the bonded indentured, the day make their report on the matter and figures following (to Wm. S. Barlow to our clerk of the County Court of Southampton which is hereto annexed, on the bondsmen's have provided to let, to the lowest indentured the repairs of the bridge over said Mills Swamp - presentation by Samuel Pond for the sum of forty eight dollars and fifty cents the bridge over said swamp presentation by Lewis Mellons for the sum of forty five dollars and no farther report that one examined the said repairs, and find the same complete owing to Contract James makes our hands this 11th day of May 1815, George B. Holt, Recorder of the County Court, Bondsmen's" (which is ordered to be entered of record)

On the motion of Samuel Pond, It is ordered that the Sheriff of the County out of any contingent money in his hands after satisfying the bonded indentured make and attach at Securus Mills let pay to said Saml Pond the sum of forty eight dollars and fifty cents also pay into Lewis Mellons the sum of forty five dollars, and account with the Court according to law

On the motion of Jesse Shankford known as to Richard and Elizabeth Nick, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of taxes and damages on a tract of land containing three hundred and nine acres and the other containing three hundred and fifteen acres which were returned in the name of Parker Nick, estate for the year 1805 the Attorney for the Commonwealth being present

On the motion of William Peters It is ordered, that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on a tract of land containing eighty three and three quarters acres which was returned in the name of James Alpert for the years 1795, 1800 and 1801 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of John Pinner, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of taxes and damages on a tract of land, which was returned in the name of Henry Alpert for the year 1795 containing eighty three and a third acres, The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present

George B. Holt, is by the Court recommended to his exonerate the James or Shub, Magistrate of the Commonwealth of Virginia to his lieutenants of a company of militia in the 60th Regiment and Jesse Holloman in the name of Richard B. Holt who have returned Jesse Bailey to be lieutenant and George B. Holt to be Sergeant in the said company
