On the motion of Peggy Battle who made out an Indenture with Nathaniel Pierce and Rice B. Pierce her executors interred into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand dollars conditioned, as the law directs, that Pierce is granted his for obtaining Letters of administration on the estate of Septe Battle deceased in our favor.

On the motion of Septe Basly, It is order that he be exonerated from the payment of the Taxes and damages on one hundred and forty three acres of Land which was returned in the name of Septe Washington for the years 1811, 1812 and 1813. The attorney for the Commonwealth being present.

On the motion of William Hancock, It is order that he be exonerated from the payment of Taxes and damage on eighty acres of land which was returned in the name of Samuel Hancock for the year 1812, The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present.

About Rice B. Pierce Present Jeremiah Coff Court Justice

Peggy Battle is by the court appointed Guardian to Abraham, Sally, Martha and Septe Battle orphans of Septe Battle deceased who together with Nathaniel Pierce and Rice B. Pierce her executors interred into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Three thousand dollars with Sureties according to law.

Order a that Lewis B. Roast, William Amon, Leonard Coff and Thaddeus Morris or any three of them being first sworn before a magistrate of this County to appear in our Court money the value of any and personal estate of Septe Battle deceased and return the appearance to the Court.
