Ordered that Reuben B. Keast, Matthew Stone, Jeremiah Cobb and Nathaniel Pierce or any three of them being first sworn before a magistrate of this County, to appraise in current money the value of any and personal estate of Sefo Battle deceased and return the appraisement to the Court.
