 a dollar Thirty three cents To George Powell my man Anthony, he the one  
 to George to pay forty Seven dollars due to Stephen Powell before Due and owing  
 to the Stephen to receive Fifty three dollars. And by a further decree  
 bearing date May Term 1815 Be the said undersigned Commissioners, do on  
 the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1816 To write a deed for the said Land to John  
 Atkins, the purchaser and take here and remit to the Guardians of all and  
 every of the aforesaid legatees, except John Powell he being of lawful age.  
 Given under our hands this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February 1816 Thomas Hartman, Thomas  
 Porter, Henry Porter Commissioners in Memphis or in due course where that the  
 division made so aforesaid between the parties proportionately occur between the parties

 returned for the year 1799 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

About Silas Summerville Present George Bush Justice

On the motion of Lewis Morris, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment  
 of the taxes and damage on nine and two thirds of an acre of land which was returned  
 in the name of Josiah Morris for the year 1799 and also on one hundred acres of land  
 which was returned in the name of John Brewster for the year 1805 (The Attorney  
 for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of Harry Harris, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment  
 of the taxes and damage on three hundred and thirty seven acres of land which  
 was returned in the name of James Harris for the years 1805 and 1816 (The  
 attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of James Recky, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment  
 of the taxes and damage on three hundred and fifty five acres of land it is a part  
 of four hundred and Seventy eight acres which was returned on the name of James
