Sixty Seven Cents To James Powell, negro slave and buy the said slave to pay twenty
a dollar thirty three cents To George Powell negro man clothing, he the said
George to pay forty Seven dollars and to Stephen Powell negro Dick according
to the Appraisal to receive fifty three dollars. And by a further decree
bearing date May Term 1814 the said undersigned Commissioners, did on
the 1st day of February 1814 execute a deed for the said land to John
Alkins, the purchaser and take bond and security to the Guardians of all and
every of the aforesaid legacies, except John Powell he being of lawful age.
Shew under our hands this 18th day of February 1815. Thomas Harris, Thomas
Porter, Henry Porter Commissioners. Wherefore it is decreed and ordered that the
decision made go shew as before said farm and stable farms and that the costs be
proportionally borne between the parties.

On the motion of James Turner, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment
of the taxes and damages on Twenty five acres of land which was returned in the name of
William Schwann (of Harey) for the year 1813. (The Attorney for the Commonwealth
being present)

On the motion of Henry Lee, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the
taxes and damages on one hundred and fifty acres of land which was returned in his
name for the year 1799 and also on Twenty and three quarter acres of land which was
returned for the year 1799 and also on Twenty and a half acres of land which was
returned for the year 1799 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

About Liles Lammont Present George Enaley Bush Justice

On the motion of Lewis Morell, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment
of the taxes and damages on nine and two thirds of an acre of land which was returned
in the name of Josiah Morell for the year 1799 and also on one hundred acres of land
which was returned in the name of John Brewshaw for the year 1805 (The Attorney
for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of Nancy Harris, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment
of the taxes and damages on Two hundred and thirty Seven acres of land which
was returned in the name of John Harris for the years 1805 and 1806 (The
Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of George Ricks, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment
of the taxes and damages on Three hundred and fifty five acres of land it is a part
of four hundred and Twenty eight acres which was returned in the name of Isaac
Mellissus Estate for the year 1797 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of Thomas Prather, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the
taxes and damages on fifty one acres of land, it being a portion of Two hundred Twenty eight
acres of land which was returned in the name of Edward Williams Estate for the year
1797 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)
