

On the Motion of Benjamin M. Shuster, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on two hundred and fifty acres and one half an acre of land it being part of a tract of three hundred and forty five acres which was returned in the name of Timothy Rufus Estate for the years 1794, 1795, 1796, 1797 and 1799 and that the estate of William Blunt be liable to reimburse from the payment of the taxes and damages due on the balance of the above tract of land which was returned for the same years (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the Motion of Benjamin M. Shuster, It is ordered that all the taxes and damages in the name of Nathaniel Drake be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages are thereon. (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

John Day Guardian to Sarah Hunderd orphan of J. Hunderd deceased has returned an account of said orphans estate which was examined and allowed by this Court and is ordered to be entered of record.

The persons appointed by a former order of this Court to divide the Land and Slaves whereof John Moscard died seized and possessed this day made their report in the words and figures following to wit: "Southampton Co. Pursuant to an order of the Court we have laid off allotted and apportioned to Sally Moscard widow and relict of John Moscard deceased as her dower for life one third part of the land which the said John Moscard died seized and possessed to wit Beginning at a small red oak in John Jaynes line thence a straight line through the apple orchard to a stake a corner in the town field thence along a line of marked trees to a big oak a corner by the side of a small branch thence a straight line to a pine a marked oak in Temple's line thence along the said Temple's line to a pine a corner in John Jaynes line thence along the said Jaynes line to the beginning. We have also assigned to the said Sally Moscard one third part of the Slaves, to wit the said John Moscard died seized and possessed to wit six and three quarters as he owned in the same, one man and one of the remaining two thirds of the said Land and Slaves and apportioned the amount of the said third equally amongst the complainants as follows, To wit: We assign to Nancy, Elizabeth, Polly, Nicholas, Samuel, Jesse and James Moscard, One hundred and eighty five dollars and twenty one Cents each, which is each one proportionally a part of the amount of Sales of said Land and Slaves making in the whole the sum of \$135 and 25 Cents with interest from the 1st day of February 1816 till paid. Some under and over our hands this 15th day of May 1816. Laurence Cole W. Phillips, Robert Bryant Commissioners. Whereupon it is ordered and ordered that the several monies as aforesaid be paid to the said Sally and that the costs be proportionally borne between the parties.
