On the Motion of Benjamin M. Johnston, It is ordered that he be compensated from the payment of the taxes and damages one thousand and five hundred and six half an acre of land it being part of a tract of three hundred and forty six acres which was returned in the name of Dorothy Robins Estate for the year 1794, 1795, 1796, 1797 and 1799 and that the Estate of William Blundell be compensated from the payment of the taxes and damages due on the balances of the above tract of land which was returned for the same years (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the Motion of Benjamin M. Johnston, It is ordered that all the land returned in the name of Wm. Blundell Esq; be compensated from the payment of the taxes and damages due thereon (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

John Day Guardian to Sarah Kindred orphan of J. Kindred deceased has returned an account of said orphans Estate which was examined and allowed by the Court and is ordered to be entered of record

The persons appointed by a former order of this Court to divide the Land are Slaves whereof John Woodard died seized and prepared this day more than report in the mode and figures following to wit — Southampton Lett. Burnett in an order directed; we have had off settled and apportioned to Sally Woodard widow and rest of John Woodard deceased as her dower for life one third part of the land which the said John Woodard died seized and prepared & to not begin at a hawthorn oak, w^e John Joyner line, thence a straight line through the apple orchard to a Stake a corner in the corn field, thence along a line of mulberry trees to a red oak a corner by the side of a small branch thence a straight line to a pine a marker took in Temperline moss medium thence along the said Temperline line to a pine a corner in John Joyner line, thence along the said Joyner line to the beginning. We have also apportioned to the said Sally Woodard one third part of the Land, whereof the said John Woodard died seized and prepared, Total Cap^r 100 Pounds as he died in the same, And made out of the remaining two thirds of the said Land are slaves and apportioned the amount of the said third equally amongst the claimants as follows, to Mrs. M^r apportioned Nancy, Anthony, Billy, Robert, Daniel, Jep^r and Ann Woodard, One hundred and Eighty Six dollars and Twenty one Cents worth, which is each one fifteenth part of the amount of Sales of said Land and slaves making the total sum of £15.13 and 8d Cents with interest from the 4th day of February 1816 till paid.
