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The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present

Thomas Butts appeared in Court according to the condition of his recognizance to answer the Complaint of James Hall against him for a breach of the peace and the said James Hall being lawfully called did not appearing Whereupon It is ordered that the said Thomas Butts be forthwith discharged.

Willie Dole appeared in Court according to the condition of his recognizance to answer the Complaint of Giles Luter against him for a breach of the peace Whereupon finding Matthew be sworn and examined touching the premises and the said Dole and Luter fully heard, It is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Dole give Security for his good behavior for the term of twelve months that is to say himself in the sum of five hundred dollars with two Sureties to be bound with him in that sum of five hundred and fifty dollars each and in default thereof that he be committed to Jail

On the motion of Sally Stennally It is ordered that she be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on fifty two acres of land which was returned in the name of John Stennally for the years 1798 and 1800 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of Jacobus M. Lott It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on three hundred and fifty four acres and one half acres of land which was returned in the name of Jacobus Lott for the years 1806 and 1807 also from the taxes and damages on three hundred and fifty four acres of land which was returned in the name of Mary Lott for the year 1806 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)
