

On the motion of John Drury, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on the hundred and fifty acres of Land which was returned in his name for the years 1798. Also on one hundred and twenty five acres of Land which was returned for the years 1800 and 1806 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of Humphrey Drury, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on Three hundred and thirty seven acres of Land and on one hundred and twelve acres of Land which was returned in the name of William Harp for the year 1793 the other tract containing 587 acres returned for the years 1795 and 1797 Also on two hundred and ninety four acres and 3/4 of an acre of Land which was returned in the name of the said Harp for the years 1798 and 1799 Also on two hundred and ninety four acres of Land returned for the year 1800 Also on two hundred and ninety four acres and 1/4 of an acre of Land returned for the year 1801 Also on two hundred and twenty five acres of Land returned in the name of said Harp for the years 1805, 1806, 1809 and 1812 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

Willie Dole with Joseph Brett and James Johnson his Sureties here in Court solemnly acknowledged themselves to be indebted to his excellency Nelson Long Nicholas Esq. Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth the said Willie Dole in the sum of Three hundred dollars and the said Joseph Brett and James Johnson in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars each of their respective goods and chattels and Lands and tenements to be hold, and to our said Governor and his Successors for the space of the Commonwealth rendered. Not upon this condition that if the said Willie Dole shall keep the Peace and be of good behaviour towards all the high people of this Commonwealth more especially to wade a certain Giles Lator for the term of twelve months then this recognizance to be void.

On the motion of Edwin Davis, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on two hundred acres of Land which was returned in the name of Allen Dodge for the year 1800 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)

On the motion of Bailey Drake, It is ordered that he be exonerated from the payment of the taxes and damages on one hundred acres of Land which is returned in his name for the year 1806 (The Attorney for the Commonwealth being present)
