Ordered that James Jones, William Rogers and Lewis Rogers as any two of them do appear Kate and Little as owners of the slave in the estate of Elizabeth Rogers deceased and make a report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that James Jones, William Rogers and Lewis Rogers as any two of them do appear Kate and Little as owners of the slave in the estate of Sarah Jones deceased and make a report thereof to the Court.
