This Cause being docketed by Consent of parties and a part of the Court came on this day
to hear on the bill answer exhibits and arguments of Counsel whereupon are upon due
consideration thereof had the Court are of opinion that William Blunt the younger altho he died
without lawfull issue had at the time of his death an absolute fee simple estate in the lands
and water mill devised to him in his Father William Blunts the Elder's last will and
testament, and that the devise over to Jhn Norfleet Blunt in case William Should die
without issue was too remote to take effect it being after an indefinite future if issue
They therefore order adjudge and decree that Allen Jones, Benjamin W. Johnston, James Lee
James W. Lamp and Edmund Turner Jr. or any two of them with the County Surveyor to divide
the tract of land of which William Blunt the younger did seize unto his equal parts
having regard as well to quality as quantity by proper metes and bounds and that they assign
and allot one Sixth part to James Kello and Mary M. his wife in right of his said wife Mary
one Sixth part to Francis Risley and Louisa R his wife in right of his said wife Louisa R
one Sixth part to Ann S. Wilkinson, one Sixth part to Eliza W. Blunt, one Sixth part to
Martha P. Blunt and the remaining Sixth part to the deft Jhn Norfleet Blunt,
they further decree that the water mill mentioned in the Complainants bill and
devised in the will of William Blunt the Elder to the said William Blunt the younger be
sold on a credit of twelve months by the aforesaid Commissioners or any two of them
and that they take by bonds of equal amount from the purchaser or purchasers with
appropriate security and assign the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof
and it is further decreed and ordered that the said defendant Jhn Norfleet Blunt do
account with the aforesaid Commissioners for the rents and profits of the aforesaid tract of
land and Mill from the first day of January 1814 and that they make a report
to this Court of their acting and doings therein in order to a final decree.

Ordered that Arthur Holloman, John Morris and Silas Lummereill or any two of them
do examine State and Settle an account of the administration on the estate of William
Holloman deceased and make a report thereof to the Court.

Dreary Waller is by the Court appointed Guardian to Henry Bittle, Dreary Bittle, Fanny
Bittle and Elsey Bittle orphans of Robert Bittle deceased who together with Henry J. P.
Westbrook and Boral Brantley his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of Three Thousand dollars with conditions according to law.
